Update, No 4 – October 2016

Goma, Democratic Republic of Congo

Rev. Desire (about to become a bishop in Goma – congratulations!) and his wife Claudaline have recently reported that they have purchased 20 sewing machines, enabling 42 women and girls to be in training this term; some girls are orphans or school dropouts owing to poverty; many women have lost husbands who were killed in the war or fled the town for safety. In addition, the money we sent earlier this year has helped in the construction of school latrines and one classroom for orphans.

WCCYM – West Cambridge Christian Youth Ministries

We continue to offer financial support to WCCYM, whose youth workers, including our own Jonathan Buwert, run Christian groups and offer pastoral support in local secondary schools. Opportunities for young people from churches in the area to meet up include the monthly 'Thirst' get-together for a meal and worship, and the 'Live & Amped' music evening on 19th November. Uzimatele Foundation, Nairobi, Kenya

We continue to support Pastor George and Jackline as they increase the number of children in the Children's Home and seek registration with the Kenyan government as a charitable organisation. The first child who entered the Home in 2004 has just started a university law degree; of the other resident children, one is in technical training, 6 are at secondary school and 7 at primary school.





Specific financial needs include funds for a new classroom at the Educational Centre in Gituamba slums, expansion of the training centre for widows and young people and sound equipment and Sunday School repairs for the Community Church.

In September 2016, The Link, one of the worshipping communities that makes up Cambourne Church, "twinned" a block of toilets at




The Vine School with toilets in an African community through the charity Toilet Twinning (www.toilettwinning.org).

For the communities in Africa, the money raised through Toilet Twinning enables them to have access to clean water, a proper toilet and information about basic hygiene and how to stay healthy. For some - especially women – it takes away the risk of attack when having to use

bushes and secluded spots away from their villages. Such safety is something that we all take for granted, especially in a place where many of our homes have more than one toilet!

This has strengthened church links with the school, engaging the pupils in assembly, and working with them to raise more money to twin more of the toilet blocks in the school.

We use the **five 'marks of mission'** to guide our decisions about priorities for giving and to ensure a balance in our commitment to various aspects of mission:

- 1. To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom (tell)
- 2. To teach, baptize and nurture new believers (teach/train)
- 3. To respond to human need by loving service (tend)
- 4. To seek to transform unjust structures of society (transform)
- 5. To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the earth *(treasure)*

We also consider the sustainability of any commitments we make, so that, where possible, mission organisations and projects can count on regular giving over the medium to long term.
