Uzimatele Foundation, Nairobi, Kenya

We continue to support Pastor George and Jackline who thank God for the life and health of the children in their Family Home which they are repainting at the moment. They have also just built a greenhouse at the school from which they hope to harvest tomatoes and vegetables to feed the children in the near future. They are delighted with the Year 6 classroom (picture opposite) which was built in December/January with donations from Cambourne Church.





Specific financial needs at the moment include a project to build a wall around the Community Church in order to improve security, owing to break-in problems recently. WCCYM – West Cambridge Christian Youth Ministries

Young people from Cambourne and other local villages continue to meet monthly on Sundays for *"Thirst"*, to share a meal together, worship, pray and share something from the Bible. A punting trip and BBQ was organised in late June and a good number will be heading off to Soul Survivor again in August, held in Peterborough this year. Visit <u>www.wccym.org</u> for more details.

Goma, Democratic Republic of Congo

Bishop Desire has recently confirmed 68 new Christians in 3 urban Goma parishes and outreach by the Anglican Church is focusing on marginalised people such as pygmies, prostitutes and returning refugees. An agropastoral project funded by Tearfund has enabled 50 household to receive a goat each and bean seeds. In addition, two projects have provided guttering and cisterns so that people can collect water from tanks rather than from puddles in the road! 500 young people are expected to attend a big one week youth conference in Goma in July, which will include evangelism, musical concerts and a

football match for peace. The theme of the conference will be "UNITY".

Through the ASDIG charity, Claudaline has issued certificates to 50 women and girls in industrial tailoring courses after one year of training. In the rural area in Kalehe Territory, Claudaline is also seeking to uplift the social and economic programme for vulnerable women and survivors of sexual violence. About 300 beneficiaries have started some commercial business on a small scale. ASDIG will also be looking after orphan children for two weeks during the July school holidays at a day care centre, organising games, food and medical provision. At the local primary school, children are awaiting the results of exams to

see if they can progress to secondary school. Under a water, hygiene and sanitation programme, flushing toilets are about to be completed. Desire and Claudaline are very grateful for our prayers for their whole ministry......please continue to pray!

BMS (Baptist) World Mission

In 2016 we were very pleased to support Ben Francis, based in Kolkata, India, and heading up the work of 'Big Life Ministries' in West Bengal. We were grateful to learn more of his work through Simon Goddard, our Regional Baptist Minister, who visited Ben in early 2017. Ben works with some of the most marginalised people of the region, using the BMS boat "Peace 3" to reach isolated villages. This enables much needed medical support (both doctors and medicines) to reach these communities as well as allowing Ben and his team to play games and develop activities with the local children. Alongside this, Ben coordinates a church-planting project in these primarily Muslim communities, establishing small church groups of 10-15 individuals and encouraging their growth. Through this ministry, many individuals, including some as young as 18, have been trained in church-planting and homeleading, meaning that the gospel has been heard in thousands of villages! In addition, BMS have launched "Streetservants", organising over 20 medical camps on the streets of Kolkata helping over 1800 people with good medical care.
